WHAT IS CERT?

CERT stands for Community Emergency Response Team and it means neighbor-helping-neighbor. CERT training promotes a partnering effort between emergency services and the people that they serve. The goal is for emergency personnel to train volunteers in basic response skills. CERT members are then called on to assist their community when emergencies happen.

WHY TAKE THE CERT TRAINING?

The primary reason for CERT training is to give people the decision-making, organizational, and practical skills to offer immediate assistance to family members, neighbors, and associates while waiting for help. While people will respond to others in need without the training, the goal of the CERT program is to help people do so effectively and efficiently without placing themselves in unnecessary danger.

WHAT CAN CERT MEMBERS DO IN BATON ROUGE?

Assist in natural or man-made disasters

Participate in numerous drills with emergency agencies and the various companies within the chemical industry

Help recruit CERT members

Conduct triage and basic treatment

Search for victims trapped in debris

Volunteer for community activities such as expos, presentations, and even parades!

Assist with evacuating

Handling donations in time of need
