TIN/STEEL CANS

Food and pet food cans



CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

All sizes of folded and flattened cardboard

GLASS

Clear, green and brown food and beverage containers



PAPER

Including magazines, catalogs, newspapers, newspaper, phone books, inserts, office paper, paperboard, junk mail

Did You Know?

There is more than one kind of recycling symbol.



"Recyclable" Symbols

When identified with either one of these symbols, products, containers or packaging materials are referred to as recyclable products, or products that are able to be recycled. A product marked with either symbol can be recycled if local regulations and/or ordinances allow.



"Recycled" Symbol

A product, which may be a container or package, marked with either one of these symbols was manufactured with at least some materials that have been recycled. When a percentage is shown, that percentage of the product has been made from recycled materials.

Did You Know?

- * Recycling paper uses 60% less energy than manufacturing paper from raw materials.
- * If we saved all the wood and paper that we toss into the trash each year, the combined amount would be enough to heat 50 million homes for up to 20 years.
- * Producing a soda can from aluminum uses 95% less energy than manufacturing a can from ore and produces 95% less air pollution and 97% less water pollution.
- * Recycling just one aluminum can save enough energy to power a television for three hours.
